The programme is for teachers who are teaching is primary, middle, secondary and higher secondary school or any graduate. This programme has been developed to prepare teachers and parents to help adolescents to develop healthy life style.

Objectives: The programme will enable the learners to;

- Strengthen their knowledge in understanding needs and concern of adolescent.
- Build knowledge on physical cognitive, emotional and psychological changes in adolescent.
- Develop skills in handling challenges related to adolescents.
- Identify their role in life skills education and counselling of adolescent.

Eligibility: Teacher who are teaching in primary, middle, secondary & higher secondary school or graduates.

Medium of Instruction: English

Duration: Minimum: **Six** months Maximum: **Two** years

Fee Structure: Rs. 2000/- per student (Subject to change)

EVALUATION

For Theory Courses:

Theory Courses

For theory courses, evaluation comprises three aspects:

- 1. **Self-evaluation check your progress** exercises (non-credit) within each unit of study material.
- 2. Continuous evaluation through assignments (Tutor Marked). In the final results all the assignments carry 30 percent weightage. Assignment to be submitted by student at study centre,
- 3. Summative evaluation for theory will be through university Term End Examination. Offline Term end examination for theory will be June and December every year. Term-End Examination for each course with a weightage of 70%. In order to successfully complete a theory course, the student must obtain at least '50%' in each assignment separately and '50%' in the Term-End Examination (TEE) separately in each course.

For Practical the Evaluation consists as two aspects:

1) Continuous Evaluation for practical's through self activities and supervised activities.

Practical self activities (as per guidelines given in manual) student need to complete the files and submit at study centre.

As supervised practical activity Student need to prepare a case study on selected Adolescent as per the guidelines given in section 4.6 and need to submit case study file and do presentation

Self and Supervised activity will be evaluated by academic counselor.

Note: Students are required to do the presentation of the case study in your programme study centre in front of peer group (through virtual mode). Preparation of case study and presentation carries 100 marks.

Continuous assessment during field work will carry 50 percent weightage (25 percent for self-activities and 25 percent for supervised activities). Students are required to score 50 percent marks in self-activities and 50 percent marks in supervised activities separately.

ii) Final Practical Examination will carry 50 percent weightage which will be conducted through virtual mode by internal and external examiner in the subject. Students are required to score 50 percent marks separately in the final practical examination to be declared successful.

Assignment

There are two assignments (one for each theory course). The answers to assignment questions are to be based on your own judgement and experiences as a student. You should not reproduce the text materials or copy the information from other sources. However, you may use the course material and any other sources of information you have for ready reference. But, the answer should be in your own words and should reflect your own ideas.

You will have to do one assignments for each course. Each assignment carries 100 marks. Irrespective of the year of registration you need to submit the latest assignments uploaded on the website. Please note that your assignment responses carry 30% weightage towards the final evaluation of each theory course.

If you do not complete the assignments according to time schedule of assignments of the relevant academic session, then you have to attempt the assignment questions of the next session and submit the assignment responses according to the schedule of that session. Irrespective of the year of registration you need to submit the latest assignments uploaded here.

The student is required to score 50 percent marks in each Assignments separately

For Practical Courses:

- There is one practical course for 2 credits has one block.
- CNS-AHL- 001 Block has 04 practicals
- First introduction to the course is given followed by introduction to the practical manual.
- Each practical unit has a structure, introduction and objectives to be achieved, content and steps to follow to carry out the practical and other related activities.
- At the end of the practical block(page-47-48), a list of self activities (Total -3) and supervised activities ((Total -1) with number of hours to be spent and marks weightage is given for the reference
- Carry out supervised activities with academic counsellor during practical contact sessions and complete the self activities at School/ Home/ Neighborhood/ Friends
- Student will submit the Self Activities file to the Academic Counsellor for evaluation and Supervised Activities will also be evaluated by the Academic Counsellor during supervised practical contact session.

Please Note that:

Continuous assessment during field work will carry 50 percent weightage (25 percent for self-activities and 25 percent for supervised activities). Student are required to score 50 percent marks in self-activities and 50 percent marks in supervised activities separately.
